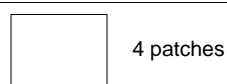
Key Block (27/100 actual size)

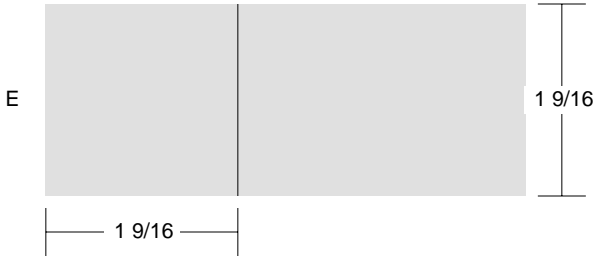


Cutting Diagrams
